# WHAT YOU NEED TO KNOW AS A HOST:

As a trainer, I need a place to deliver my training. Hosting my training in settings and schools mean that the space is both appropriate and local to a delegates. Hosts provide a minimal amount of resources and as a thank you I provide free spaces on my training for the host setting or school.

## **As a host you provide:**

- \* A large space such as a classroom, meeting room or a hall. Ideally each space should be able to hold 30-40 people + tables for resources. Smaller spaces can work so please email me to discuss this.
- \* A projector OR a blank wall for me to project my own onto.
- \* Tea and Coffee for all attending delegates.
- \* Chairs for all delegates
- \* Upto 6 tables to display resources.

## **As a trainer I provide:**

- \* Free tickets for your staff (See each event for total)
- \* Discounts on 'extra' tickets.
- \* I take care of all ticket sales but provide you with marketing materials if you wish to share with your family of schools.

## **Additional things to consider:**

For each event to run there is a minimum number of tickets which must be sold for each event to make it cost effective to run. Usually this is 50% - I will inform you of this when you book.

I will bring a small number of resources to sell at the 'Loose parts Exhibition' and 'Maths Roadshow' events. These resources are linked to the the course content.

## LOOSE PARTS EXHIBITION

Loose parts involves using small 'loose' objects around you for children's play. The concept isn't new, but schools are finding it more and more relevant as our sector moves towards more child-centred learning.

Through this training, delegates learn about the origin of Loose Parts, how to introduce it, where to source them, how to keep children safe and how to support fellow practitioners.

This training is a mixed approach of presentation and plenty of 'hands on' exploration of a wealth of resources - bring your camera!

**Pack away time:** 30 minutes


**Designed for:** All staff working in Early Years (0-5) and KS1

# MATHS ROADSHOW

Do you have children in Reception who are not making the expected progress? Do you have children in Nursery but you're not sure what they should be learning? This course is designed to support practitioners working with children 2-5 in developing an understanding of the earliest foundations of mathematics. Delegates will examine the earliest skills which children need to develop and how we can support children to continue to develop these in Nursery and Reception.

This course also supports delegates to develop mathematical language, use appropriate resources, develop problem solving/challenge as well as bridge the gap into Year one (where appropriate). **Please note this course will be updated to reflect the revised EYFS once this is finalised.**

This training is a mixed approach of presentation and plenty of 'hands on' exploration of a wealth of resources - bring your camera!

**Session length:** 1.5 hours.

**Set up time prior to event:** 45 minutes

**Pack away time:** 30 minutes

**Designed for:** Early Year staff working with 2-5 year olds and KS1 staff working with children on the EYFS framework.

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# PURPOSEFUL PROVISION

Do you have provision in your setting that falls a bit flat? Can you justify why you're delivering learning through provision? Do you have 'dead zones' in your classroom? This training is designed to support you in making every part of your environment work just as hard as you do!

Through this training, delegates are supported to understand how and why we do provision the way we do. Delegates will be supported to think about placing the child at the centre when designing provision. This hands on session is designed to challenge practitioners to develop the provision as a tool for learning and not just something which looks nice!

This training blends a mixture of approaches including a presentation, workshop activities and exploration of some resources.

**Session length:** 2 hours.

**Set up time prior to event:** 30 minutes

**Pack away time:** 20 minutes

**Designed for:** Staff working with 2-5 year olds including NQTs, RQTs, New to Early Years staff & those wishing to deepen their understanding of provision.

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# FABULOUS PHASE 1 PHONICS

Too many practitioners rush children towards phase 2 phonics and don't spend the time they need on developing the foundations in Phase 1.

Children need to have a solid understanding about recognising and making sounds, keeping a beat, understanding speech sounds as well as learning how to talk about the sounds they hear.

This active, hands on course is designed to support practitioners to recognise that phase 1 phonics can be woven into many activities already ongoing within their settings. It further supports them in understanding when to move children onto phase 2 and what to do when gaps exist.

This training blends a mixture of approaches including a presentation, workshop activities and exploration of some resources. Delegates will be required to move about and should therefore wear suitable clothing and footwear (non-strenuous)

**Session length:** 2 hours.

**Set up time prior to event:** 30 minutes

**Pack away time:** 20 minutes

**Designed for:** Any staff who will be teaching phase 1 phonics.
